Dear Parents and Carers,

What a week we have had with the 'special phonecall' on Monday morning to tell us that Ofsted would be in school for the next two days for a full graded inspection. We had been anticipating their visit and a very busy 55 hours followed for everyone in school to pull together to show what we do to at Churchfields to the inspectors.

It was a very thorough and intense scrutiny of all aspects of the school with four inspectors (including two senior HMI inspectors) on Tuesday and two on Wednesday leaving no stone unturned by:

- meeting with leaders
- observing lessons in all classes, some multiple times

- talking with groups of children on different topics
- talking with staff
- looking at children's exercise books
- checking safeguarding arrangements
- checking children's individual EHCP plans are being followed in classrooms
- observing breakfast club, playtime, lunchtime and after school club
- meeting with trustees and governors
- listening to children read
- meeting many of you at the gates on Wednesday
- many meetings with myself and John Grove, CEO of the Quality First Education Trust
- looking at parents/carer, staff and pupil surveys

We are happy with the draft outcome and although a tiring process, it felt like they had understood the school and our community by the end.

The report will be published in 8 weeks or so as it needs to go through their checking and quality assurance process but I was really pleased that they saw how polite, confident and enthusiastic your children are. They recognised the ambition and quality of the curriculum we provide across all subjects and the skills and knowledge of the staff in delivering this. They saw excellent behaviour and attitudes from the children, a lively and bright Early Years environment and were particularly impressed with what is on offer with enrichment opportunities, developing children's leadership skills and how deeply our children understand issues of diversity and equality, mental health and justice. They had a couple of suggestions for further development in being even more precise in our teaching and helping children to show self-control without needing an adult that we had already started to work on before they came – it's reassuring to know we are on the right track. I'm confident that by the time the report comes out we will already have improved as we are working to make the school the best it can be for your children and your family regardless of whether Ofsted have been or not.

I am so proud of our school community and thank you and the staff for all of your support this week and since I joined the school last year. The inspectors said that the vast majority of the 176 of you that completed their survey and spoke with them directly had really positive things to say about the school – thank you for taking the time to do this. I was so very touched by the massive response to the call for last year's exercise books – it shows what a supportive and engaged community you are, thank you. There were a small number of not so positive responses – we don't get to see the written comments so please do contact me directly so I can hear your concerns and work to make improvements – I like feedback!

It's always good to keep perspective on an Ofsted visit and I'm sure the most important thing that happened this week from your children's point of view is that the chef found a way to get chips back on the lunch menu today – they were literally cheering in the lunch hall! 
