Supporting Children with the News of Queen Elizabeth's Death

What will happen in school:

Children and adults may find the news cycle over the coming weeks overwhelming with a sense of collective grief and talk of death and funerals.

There will be opportunities for children to learn about the Queen's life and what is happening to commemorate her in the coming weeks, as well as time to discuss their feelings as needed as part of this.

Your child's wellbeing is our top priority and if your child is upset by this news and would like additional support, please encourage them to speak to their class teacher or any other member of staff.

Advice from a child psychologist:

No matter how you feel about the monarchy, a family has lost their much loved matriarch and many around the world will be mourning the loss of a strong woman who was a constant in turbulent times.

The following days could prove unsettling to children. There will be a sense of collective grief, TV and radio will change, there will be constant sombre music and talk of death and funerals. All this is coming at a time of societal change and with children starting in new year groups or schools.

What's the best way to handle this with children? We shouldn't shield children from death. If we don't talk to them about it, somebody else will, or they will overhear a conversation.

When somebody dies, whether in our close family or someone who played an important role in our life, like the Queen, we should take time to sit and explain to children what has happened, using simple child-friendly language. Avoid using ambiguous terms such as "passed away", "went to heaven" (conversations about spiritual beliefs can happen later) or "gone to sleep". Instead be clear that the Queen has died - actively using the term dead/died.

It's natural for children to ask questions. Try to answer them honestly and accurately, however uncomfortable or inappropriate they may feel. It's also natural for them to worry about you, or others, dying. Try to reassure them but again be honest.

Children may like to process the news by drawing pictures or writing about the Queen (this is akin to adults writing in a book of condolence).

If you are upset at the news (or it has triggered past grief in you), don't feel you have to hide your emotions. It is good for children to see us grieving. Similarly, it is fully appropriate for children to be allowed to watch the funeral on TV if they would like to.



Dear Parents and Carers,

I wanted to start our first newsletter of the year by thanking you all for the exceptionally warm welcome you and your children have given me this week on the gates, in the playgrounds and around school – I appreciate it very much and already feel part of the family. I am very happy and proud to be the new headteacher at Churchfields.

I grew up in East Lancashire (in the Rossendale Valley which is between Burnley, Blackburn and Rochdale) and have been teaching in London for over 20 years. My previous school was also in the Q1E trust, Belleville Primary School, where I was Co-Headteacher for the last 6 years with a further 8 years as Deputy Headteacher and 2 as class teacher before that.

I first worked with staff from Churchfields over 10 years ago on an equality project and our whole staff teams have worked closely together as part of the trust for the last five years. I have also had the benefit in the summer of supporting the preparation for the Ofsted inspection in April (congratulations again on the wonderful report) and I had a number of days working alongside Mr Hyndley in June and July where I could say hello and meet with many of you before the new academic year. I couldn't have asked for a better head start!

Thank you again to all of you who took the time to fill out the parent/carer survey, these were very useful for me to understand what you love about the school and how you would like it to get even better. The key area to work on from your surveys was improved communication and I hope this style of newsletter, with a summary key dates /events as the first item and lots of photos of what is happening in school (along with other 'need to know' information) will be helpful to you.

I welcome your feedback on this as with any other area of the school. You can speak to me on the gates/in the playgrounds, send me an email via the school office or we can make a time to meet together in person or over the phone.

We also have a new and improved school website almost ready to launch which I hope to share with you next week.

As you may have noticed, there was lots of activity on site over the summer with a deep clean, works to the pathways around school as well as repainting and refreshing of various areas (and a new water fountain on the playground for the younger children which has caused great excitement). My thanks to Mr Hayes and all of the staff for their hard work to get the school and classrooms ready to welcome your children.


