
Karl Nova Wows the Crowds

When the number of school meals increased, the kitchen team thought there would not be enough oven space to cook all of the chips on a Friday and served mashed potato instead.


One determined pupil in ARC Magnolia wrote a letter and got over 60 signatures before leaving it on Ms Atherton's desk. It said:




