Celebrating Black British Women



October is Black History Month in the UK, an event that has been celebrated nationwide for more than 30 years. This year there is a special focus find out just some of incredible things women in particular have done for Britain.

It was originally founded to recognise the contributions that people of African and Caribbean backgrounds have made to the UK over many generations. Now, Black History Month has expanded to include the history of not just African and Caribbean people but all black people.

Throughout history, black people have made huge contributions to society in the fields of art, music, science, literature and many more areas. But, in the past, these contributions have often been ignored or played down because black people weren't treated the same way as other people because of the colour of their skin.

Black History Month aims to address this unfairness by celebrating the achievements and contributions of black people in the UK. In school, we make sure we recognise and celebrate the achievements of a diverse range of people all year round and in all subjects.



Malorie Blackman

The best-selling author for children and young adults, **Malorie Blackman**, was a pupil at Churchfields Primary School (when it was on the previous site) and has written about her time at school in her recent autobiography for adults!

When she was chosen to become the eighth Children's Laureate, she became the first black person to take on the role. Malorie says she wanted to "make reading irresistible" for children, by encouraging them to explore a range of literature, from short stories to graphic novels.

"If you're talking about the history of Britain, then that history includes black people and people of colour... We still need more books from the Gypsy, Roma and Traveller communities, working-class authors and books from and about neuro-divergent children."







Margaret Busby is an extremely influential name in the world of publishing. She was Britain's youngest and first black female book publisher, when she cofounded the publishing company Allison & Busby in 1967, alongside a man called Clive Allison.

The company didn't *only* publish work by black writers, but it did help to make the names of many black writers more wellknown.



Joan Armatrading was the first female UK artist to be nominated for a Grammy in the blues category. She went on to be nominated three times. She arrived in the UK at the age of seven, from the Caribbean island of Saint Kitts. She began writing songs at the age of 14 and in the 1970s, she became the first black British singer songwriter to enjoy great success abroad. In 2007, she became the first female UK artist to debut at number 1 in the Billboards blues chart in the USA.



Lilian Bader was born in 1918 in Liverpool and went on to become one of the very first black women to join the British Armed Forces.

Starting out as a canteen assistant at an army base in Yorkshire, she eventually trained as an instrument repairer, before becoming a leading aircraftwoman and soon afterwards earning herself the rank of Corporal. Three generations of her family served in the armed forces.



Dr Shirley Thompson was named as "one of the most inspirational Black British women" by the newspaper Metro. In 2004, she became the first woman in Europe to conduct and compose a symphony in the past 40 years. The piece of music celebrated London's history and was composed to mark the Queen's Golden Jubilee in 2002. She has been named in the Evening Standard's Power List of Britain's Top 100 Most Influential Black People in 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016.
