Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back and I hope you all had a relaxing half term. Please accept my apologies for the lack of a newsletter in the final week of Spring 1 - we were inundated with items you had generously donated for the Turkey/Syria earthquake that were all sorted, boxed up and sent off as you will see below.

Our trust and school ethos is to have a 'relentless drive for improvement, excellence and equality'. As part of this we invited a group of headteachers from Wandsworth, Merton and Kensington and Chelsea, along with a current Ofsted inspector, to come and spend two days at Churchfields this week to understand what we are already doing and help us to improve further.

They met with leaders from the school and the Q1E central team, they watched lessons and talked to children about their learning, they met with over 70 children over the two days to look at their work and get their feedback on a range of subjects and aspects of the school.

The group commented that the children come to school ready to learn, they were confident, articulate and comfortable to share their views with people they have never met before – a great compliment to all of the families and staff who support them.

We have clear aims and a strong curriculum on offer – we need to work further on making sure this is consistently excellent for all children and also go to the next stage of 'dreaming big' as our children have shown how capable of excelling they are and our school has the ability to offer something really special to its children, families and wider community.



Come to school in your pyjamas or wear a costume celebrating your favourite book or character. No donation needed or competition – just for fun!








Book tokens will be sent home to buy one of the special £1 books sold in booksellers and in Asda, Morrisons, Sainsbury's and Tesco.





Summer Competition

The seeds will need to be sown and grown

in pots at home and should be brought to school clearly labelled on the judging day which will take place sometime from late June to early July 2023 - this date will be confirmed closer to the time.

The LCFS Judges will only judge seeds that have been purchased from LCFS through the school.

They will award each participant with Gold, Silver or Bronze certificate for their efforts. If your plant has flowered early, a photograph of the plant at its best, along with the plant can be submitted on judging day.

Would your child like to enter the London Children's Flower Society Summer Seed Competition?

Judging Criteria

Gold will be awarded to a fully grown plant in good condition that is in flower/bud/fruit. **Silver** will be awarded to a fully grown plant without a flower/bud/fruit.

Bronze will be awarded to a seed that has been planted properly and with some indication of growth.

(If the plant matures early - photographic evidence will suffice)

Please order your seeds by Friday 3rd March using the Pay360 online or by paying through credit card in the office. A minimum purchase of £1 is needed.
