# Can you help us avoid common illnesses this winter?



At this time of year, we always see an increase in common illnesses from coughs and colds, vomiting and diarrhoea as well as Covid-19 and Strep A/Scarlet fever.

All of these are usually mild in children but are unpleasant, can affect some children and their families more and can occasionally be serious.

We will be talking to the children in school to encourage them to catch coughs and sneezes in tissues or their elbows, and to clean their hands thoroughly and more often e.g. washing hands with soap whilst singing 'Happy Birthday' twice.

We will have alcohol-based hand sanitiser available in each room for children to use if you would like them to (although this cannot kill Norovirus, it does help with other illnesses).

Please do talk with your child at home and help them get into good habits to reduce the chance of illness.

# **Anti-Bullying Week 2023**



What our children say:

"It is important to imagine what being bullied would be like. Then you will understand how they feel and why it needs to be stopped."

#### What is Bullying?

- Bullying is when someone, or a group of people, hurts or upsets another person or people on purpose more than once.
- It can take different forms. For example, it could be physical (like pushing somebody around), emotional (for example, leaving someone out) or verbal (such as calling somebody nasty names).
- Bullies often do this to gain a sense of power over the person they are bullying, who is made to feel sad, scared or alone.

# Test yourself: Is it Bullying?

- Two friends have an argument
- Someone calls another person in their class a name they don't like every day
- A group of children disagree about the rules of a game
- Different children always push one child over when they have the ball

#### **Being Respectful**

Being respectful means we act in a way that shows care about how our words and actions may affect others. We can show respect for people, places and things.

#### For example:

- Using kind or polite words even when we're upset
- Using manners like sharing, waiting your turn, saying please and thank you to every person, even if we don't like them
- Accepting difference or at least disagreeing with kind words
- Being careful not to damage places or things
- Using a quiet voice or calm behaviour in public places
- Sharing resources, only taking what we really need

### Test yourself: Is it respectful if...?

- You would be upset or annoyed if someone said or did it to you
- It's hurtful
- Someone's asked you to stop
- The person isn't laughing or enjoying what is happening
- It focuses on something someone feels sad or not confident about

We show respect and speak out against bullying at our school






# **Year 2 Science Workshop**
