



Types of places

Non-selective

Looked-after children; SEND (EHCP); siblings; distance

Banding

Test results are divided into equal groups and places are allocated from each group or band.

Selective

Some places are offered based on highest test scores.

Specialist

There are additional assessments in certain subjects – apply in Autumn term.

Foundation

Usually for children who attend a particular place of worship

The process

- September and October
 - find out about/visit schools
 - St Olave's Grammar School Stage I test
 - Newstead Wood selection tests and results sent to parents/carers
- Submit one form by 31st October for <u>any</u> London state school
- November St Olave's Grammar Stage 2 test
- December Harris Academy Beckenham and Bromley banding test
- Ist March 2023 school offers
- 15th March deadline to accept or decline offers, appeals submitted
- April December waiting list movement

State Application Process

- Complete one form/ online application from home borough.
- Apply for up to 6 schools in any borough.
- Rank the schools in order of preference.
- Applications are passed between boroughs automatically.
- Supplementary Information Forms are submitted directly to schools.

Permanent address

- The child's permanent main residence on 31st
 October must be used.
- Details about shared custody and what is accepted as a child's address are on p. 27 – 29 of the booklet
- If you change address you must notify and provide proof to the council by 5th December 2022
- Councils do check addresses places can be withdrawn if based on provision of false or misleading information.



Application Process

If the number of applications is greater than places available:

Schools follow published admission criteria - order and definitions may vary between schools

- Children Looked after (CLA) or previously looked after
- Special educational needs (EHCP)
- Siblings (on roll in September 2022)
- Exceptional medical/ social need
- Children of staff
- Distance to school (straight line measure)
- Religious commitments
- Feeder primary schools

Questions to consider

- What are the admission criteria?
- How many places are available?
- How many applications were there last year?
- How many were admitted under each criterion?
- Up to what distance from the school were places offered last year?
- Information for last year is found within 'Applying for a School Place' and previous years available online.

Myths

- If you only put one school on the form, the council have to give you that school.
 - False parental preference; if that school cannot offer a place, the nearest school that has places will be offered to you
- If you put your form in earlier than 31st October, you are more likely to get your choice of school.
 - False not processed until after 3 Ist October; no advantage
- If you miss the deadline of 31st October but have a good reason it doesn't matter
 - False all applications received after 3 Ist October will only be considered after all of the other places have been allocated
- If you put a state school as your 1st choice, you are more likely to get that school or they give these children places first.
 - False this would have to be part of the published admissions criteria; not used any more. Schools don't know the order you have placed them on your application

Myths

- My older child already goes to the school so I don't need to apply
 - False there is no automatic admission for a sibling of a child already at a school. An application must still be made and processed
- If my neighbour got in last year, my child will get in this year
 - False There are no 'catchment areas' for any Bromley schools and the distance to the furthest place offered changes each year

The information above will help you assess the likelihood of being able to secure a place at preferred schools. Sadly, there are no guarantees of a place because ethe distance to the last place offered will vary year on year based on the size of the cohort and the demand for schools.

Online application

- Secure and confidential
- Save your form and log back in later to finish or make changes
- Receive email reminders to submit form and to receive result on 1st March 2023

Filling out the form

- Apply for up to 6 schools by 31st October most parents/carers apply online.
- A paper form can be downloaded from the admissions website.
- Rank them in order of preference.
- Each school considers the application separately each school is not aware of their position on your form and must follow their published admissions criteria
- Schools inform the borough if a place can be allocated for your child.
- If more than one school offers a place, the borough offers you the highest school on your application.
- Pupils automatically remain on the waiting list for schools above their offered school.

Filling out the form

- Include at least 4 schools.
- Include one close in distance.
- If you don't live in Bromley, you must apply through your home Local Authority but you can list schools in any borough
- If you are unsuccessful with your listed schools, your borough will allocate the school closest to you that has available places.
- State schools only offer one school at a time.

October 31st

- Online completed by midnight on 31st October
- Paper must be received by 31st October

Don't be late!


If the application is not received by your local council by 31st October, your child will not be considered for a place until after 1st March when all the places have already been given out.

If there are no places left in your preferred schools, you will go on the waiting list and be offered the nearest school which still has places left

How offers are made

An example - applies for 6 state secondary schools:

- I. Red School
- 2. Blue School
- 3. Green School
- 4. Purple School
- 5. Pink School
- 6. Orange School



When Offers are Made

You can:

- a. Accept the place (if you decide to reject the place it may not be re-offered).
- b. Find out more about why your child was not offered a particular place and their position on the waiting list by calling the council.
- c. Keep your child on the **waiting list** for a higher preference but may not be offered this place. Places on the waiting list are held until December 2023.
- d. Decide to **appeal** the deadline for this will be included in the offer letter
- e. Make a late application to schools not on your original list or lower placed than your offer

Independent Schools

September – November: Open Days

September – December: Closing dates for Applications

December and January: Tests and interviews

February and March: Outcomes of applications

Independent Schools

- You can apply for as many independent schools as you wish, but think about what your child can manage.
- All applications are treated individually by the school.
- Children can receive a number of independent school offers at the same time as the one state school offer.
- School arrangements and procedures vary from school to school.
- Apply directly to each school check websites for dates/ phone to request prospectus.
- Scholarships are available for particular subjects and / or general ability check what will be required of your child, what happens to the place if things change.
- Bursaries are available for families within a certain income bracket.
- This is a more subjective process tests, interviews (even parents), references, auditions and assessment days are used to decide places.

References

- No references are required for applications to state school.
- If you require a reference for an independent school / scholarship, please email admin@churchfields.qle.org.uk by 31st October 2022.
- All references are confidential we work to give the most full picture of your child as we can and may ask you for further details to add to the reference e.g. hobbies.

General References

- Attendance and punctuality Covid-related absence will be indicated
- Academic attainment and aspects of this: e.g. problem solving in maths, engagement with the wider curriculum
- Learning skills: e.g. effort, resilience, ability to handle new concepts, follow instructions, concentration, independence
- Personal characteristics: working with peers, staff and conduct around school
- Participation: e.g. in extra-curricular clubs/ events, other aspects of school life, outside of school as reported by yourselves
- Special circumstances: SEND, exclusions, medical, English as an additional language, anything else which may have adversely affected the child's academic/ personal development or should be considered as part of a fair assessment process

Scholarship References – Art, Music, Sport

- Evaluates:
 - Areas of strength in the subject
 - Commitment to further practice
 - Relevant learning skills e.g. ability to follow coaching points and leadership in sports; ability to think creatively and generate ideas in art
- Participation in relevant clubs/ school events, participation outside of school as reported by parents and carers
- Any other circumstances which may have adversely affected the child's academic or personal development or should be considered as part of a fair assessment process
